Students can undertake this programme for three or four years, depending on whether they choose to spend a period studying abroad. This flexible course allows individuals to select the English literature modules which interest them, so they can tailor the course to their own needs. Our students explore literature as part of society and culture, at the same time developing their foreign language skills, and a range of aspects related to the language and cultures they have chosen to study.

All students will have access to our Worldwise Learning Centre, which is open year-round and offers advice and support for the study of world languages and cultures, travelling, and working or studying abroad. It also provides a comfortable place to meet and make friends with speakers of different languages in a welcoming environment. Students can learn about opportunities to apply for a travel bursary for studying or working abroad, apply for short-term internships and work experience placements and attend culture and language celebration events, shows, exhibitions and guest talks by industry professionals with international experience.
