Students get the chance to work on real-world projects throughout the course, and perform their own gigs and shows at professional venues. The course also provides the skills needed for marketing and event-management and working under commission, our students have the opportunity to put this into practice.

There are four strands that are studied throughout the course;

- Composition and performance - create and perform own music
- Applied - find clients to write music for
- Industry - real life experience in music, live sound and lighting, event management and other music industry skills
- Research - find out and write about an area of interest in Music

Throughout these strands, students create music in our rehearsal/performance spaces, record music in our recording studios and perform their own original music in the public domain. Students will also write music for a feature film, for computer games and contemporary dance, and find clients of their own choosing. They will be part of an event management team responsible for our three major events, Winter Sound, Avant Garden and Future Sound, and will work alongside other year groups, graduates, staff and famous artists.
